Standing Committee Chair Reports</p> <p>Membership Daina Swinford</p> <p>ASRS Steve Ramos</p>	<p>Daina Swinford Member count: 1945 members 571 renewals since June. Membership committee will contact 70 members who have not renewed.</p> <p>Steve Ramos reported that due to the economy there has been a migration of people into teaching positions, so teacher shortage is minimal. Return-to-work options are not as critical as once thought. Next AZ Legislative session the ASRS will have the following items put forward: Return-to-Work options: 1. Alternate contribution rate to make up for lack of funds provided by ASRS-member employees. It would have a one-year free from the alternate rate. But if return to work employee continues for another year, the district will be assessed the alternate rate. 2. If you return to work, you “unretire.” That would eliminate the year wait. ASRS will also resubmit the Plan Changes that they submitted last session.</p> <p>Steve noted that in the medical insurance program through ASRS, Medicare Complete is actually Medicare Advantage.</p> <p>Steve suggested that members go to www.thearizonawewant.org to take the survey. Lattie Coor is chair of this group working to develop the changes that citizens of Arizona want. 3 basic areas include:</p> <p>Caring for the Economy 1. Create quality jobs for all Arizonans. 2. Prepare Arizonans of all ages for careers in the 21st century workforce.</p> <p>Caring for People 3. Make Arizona “the place to be” for talented young people. 4. Provide health insurance for all, with payment assistance for those who need it.</p> <p>Caring for Communities 5. Protect Arizona’s natural environment, water supplies and open spaces. 6. Build a modern, effective transportation system and infrastructure. 7. Empower citizens and increase civic involvement. 8. Foster citizen well-being</p>
<p>9. Board Committee Chair Reports</p> <p>IMPACT – Linda Thieken</p>	<p>Linda Thieken talked about the successful new mentorship program. She is working with AEA NEA to develop Professional Development opportunities for Mentees in order that they meet their obligation for ASU. They will focus on Resume Writing, Interviewing for Positions, Classroom Management, and Conversations with Parents.</p> <p>Pres. Somo reported that she will set up a telephone conference for members of Grant Committee in November.</p> <p>Judy Moy led a discussion about renewing certificate for a retired teacher. How can work for the Association be counted toward 180 hours of continuing prof. development needed? Up to 30 hours/year can be given for Association Leadership Activities, but workshops and conferences attended for AEA count over and above those.</p>
<p>10. Coalitions Alliance – John Campbell</p>	<p>John Campbell reported on the Alliance Convention held at Wyndham Oct. 2. AEA-Ret. members in attendance included himself, J. Stephenson, J. Horwin, S. Ramos, and M. Rosin. Frank Bing and Gary Mehok were elected to Citizens Advisory Network. John Campbell was elected as Vice President.</p>

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11. AEA-Retired Chapter Chairs	<p>Susie Sommer reported that her local chapter met with state dir. Of AARP, Mr. Mitchell. They advocate for changing healthcare but haven't taken a stand on present bills. They have done a good job of dispelling myths around the health care reform. AZ AARP is presently made up of 33%Dem., 33%Rep. and 33% Independent.</p> <p>Sally Rosen reported that their chapter will meet in two weeks.</p> <p>Steve Ramos reported that Nov. 4 is Mesa's next meeting. Bloom/Nichols are coordinating that meeting.</p> <p>Mark Rosin noted that they will meet at JB's Restaurant by Christown Mall Thursday, Oct. 15.</p> <p>Linda Thieken reported that Scts/PV chapter met. Suzan Austin did an extraordinary job of organizing it and communicating with members. Their next meeting will take place Nov. 12 at Orange Tree Resort.</p> <p>Cindy Michels is coordinating Yuma local chapter leadership.</p> <p>Aurora Aber noted that at their Sept. 22 meeting the possibility of splitting into two chapters was presented. Consensus by group was not to split. They have two new chapter members. Next meeting Oct. 20. Tentative meetings for this year include the following: Nov. 17, no meeting in Dec., Jan. 19, Feb. 16, Mar. 16, Apr. 20. The chapter is working to help with the TUSD Override campaign.</p>
