	Also: how do we address the who are elected when we do not have enough representation on the board? Their term is only for 2 years according to the bylaws; we recently changed the bylaws to 3 year terms for representatives-at-large. Mike Aicone noted that on the AEA Board of Directors, minoritie Representatives-at-large elected due to same reason (not enough minority representation on the board) serve only until the board has the number of minority representation necessary.
B. LEGISLATIVE	Julie Horwin reminded members that a Spousal Notification Bil l has been passed by the legislature
Julie Horwin, Marion Pickens, Bob Bloom	and signed by the Governor. In substance, a member must notify his/her current spouse before naming a beneficiary other than the current spouse or before changing the beneficiary or before changing the election of the annuity. This was achieved through several years of work by many Arizona Retiree organizations including members of our own AEA-Retired. The Graded Multiplier Equity Bill never got out from its assigned committees. After talking to several legislators and other Retired organizations in Arizona, the prevalent feeling seems to be that such a bill
	will not be considered by the Legislature for several years. What does this mean to AEA-Retired? We may wish to take this on as a major task, in order to change that lassitude and to keep the Equity Bill in the forefront. There are too many quality of life issues for our retirees to allow this issue to die. She stated that she hopes that many of you will make yourself available to advocate for bills next session. We will keep you informed and abreast of needs for your assistance through the Conduit, the website and monthly reports at the AEA-Retired meetings.
